

Your session and their committees worked hard for our church during February and March. In February, Thomas Logan attended the PSL meeting in Baton Rouge as our commissioner. He also expressed his commitment to our church by applying to enroll in courses to become a Commissioned Pastor so he can serve at St. Andrew. The session approved helping him with expenses for this endeavor.

Also at the February meeting, the session took care of yearly housekeeping chores such as approving special offerings, electing the treasurer and clerk, approving the budget, etc. The exciting news at that meeting was that the session hired and is working with Architect Jeff Kudla to investigate our options. You may soon see testing of the safety of the Sanctuary involving removing bricks to see the condition of the concrete pillars behind the bricks. The committee is also working with Mr. Kudla on what our options are if we do not rebuild the Sanctuary on its original site. The committee is getting an appraisal for the value of the Sanctuary property, as is, to decide whether to try to sell that property.


Also at the February Meeting, the session accepted an invitation from First Presbyterian Church to join them for Maundy Thursday Worship.

At the Annual Congregational Meeting, the Congregation heard the reports of the committees, reviewed the budget for 2024, and elected Nancy Melton, Craig Long, Diana Lewis, Marilyn Dunn, and Zane Simon to be on the Nominating Committee for 2024.

In March, The Property Committee reported that Mark Couvillion had submitted a tentative plan for a security system including cameras outside and in the classrooms. In addition, the committee is working with the city to repair the washout under the street causing a large cavern to be formed under our drainage ditch.

Amy Stark and Leah Marcantel met by Zoom with representatives from the First Presbyterian Churches of Lake Charles and Welsh. The discussion included what each church considered the most important qualities in looking for a new pastor. After discussions, the representatives decided to pursue a facilitated meeting on the topic of "Why is it important to have a Presbyterian presence in SWLA?". Westminster will be invited to participate as well. The representatives recognized that it is too soon to engage in discussions regarding yoking churches.

It is frustrating that it is taking so long to move our church into the future; but, we want to be sure we make the right decisions for our congregation, and need to consult with architects, engineers, and other experts as necessary, which takes time. I would like to thank our session for their dedication to doing what needs to be done for the benefit of the future of St. Andrew.


Prayers and Concerns
